 - a) There is a team of clinicians including Consultant Psychiatrist, Psychologists, Nursing and Occupational Therapist who will provide an assessment and diagnostic service around ASD. They will also provide short term support and advice. As this is provided within existing resources, the team offer a tertiary service to the Community Mental Health Teams and Mental Health Service.
 - b) There is no specific specialist assessment & diagnostic service for Adults with ASD. however there is a Consultant Psychiatrist did providing an assessment service providing diagnosis.
